R. Tod Highsmith, Current Treasurer

Tod is a retired writer and editor in the conservation sciences. His career includes stints as an environmental educator, ornithological researcher, and staff journalist for an international bird conservation organization. He is a former officer of the Wisconsin Society for Ornithology, and served as editor of *The Passenger Pigeon*, the society's quarterly journal. He holds a Ph.D. in Zoology from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst.

Susan Schumacher

Sue is a retired Principal Ecological Scientist for a utility company where she worked on the siting, design, construction, and operation of both wind and solar farms in Wisconsin and other Midwest states. Her work included ensuring that renewable energy projects have a minimal impact on natural and cultural resources, research on bird and bat activities, as well as restoring natural habitat at these sites. Previously, she worked at the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources as a Wildlife Assistant, a Wetland Restoration Specialist, and a Water/Wetland Regulation Specialist.
